ANNUAL MEMBER OF THE YEAR AWARD

CRITERIA FOR AWARD NOMINATION:

- **Chapter-level submission:**

Nomination for *Member of the Year* may be made by the Chapter Representative, President, or members of the AVVA Chapter. The nomination must be signed, endorsed, and submitted by the Chapter Representative or President. If the nominee is the Chapter Representative or President, or if the nominee's Chapter has no elected Representative then the State Representative or State President must sign and submit the nomination form with an endorsement attached.

- **State-level submission:**

Nominations for the AVVA *Member of the Year Award* of a state-level Representative or President may be made by members of that state. The nomination must be signed, endorsed, and submitted by the Regional Director or a National Officer. The State President may sign, endorse, and submit the form if the nominee is a fellow officer. If the Region has no elected Director or Deputy then a National Officer must sign the nomination form with an endorsement attached.

- Current National Board members are ineligible for this award.
- No self-nominations are accepted.

Include the following:

1. Evidenced of the nominee's commitment to the mission and vision of AVVA
2. Overall time volunteering for AVVA
3. Information about the nominee's goals in AVVA & how they will help further the organization's goals.
4. Nominee's efforts & successes in recruitment and retention of members
5. Details of the nominee's service in the local community.
6. A list of notable accomplishments.- with supporting evidence if available.
7. Positions held as a member of AVVA (elected & appointed)
8. Required signature and letter of support.

APPLICATIONS MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN MAY 10, 2017
